The perceptions captured in the study (1) include teacher's confidence in understanding RME and its implementation in their best practices; (2) RME</p>

criteria which teachers found most challenging during the planning and the implementation. The subject of this study is 296 elementary teachers who have attended the training. The workshop series provided RME material, simulation during the workshop, teachers implementing in their best practice, and the workshop to discuss their experience. The data presents the following findings: (1) less than a half of the participants have a better understanding on RME characteristics, but more than a half of them believe that most mathematical topics can be taught by the RME approach and feel confident that they have implemented RME approach in their best practices; (2) teachers found that the most challenging when planned the RME lesson was on finding contexts related to the mathematics topics, and during the implementation, they found most difficult on leading students' discussion democratically. These results suggest that the most impactful workshop is better, followed by best practices and participants' reflection afterward.

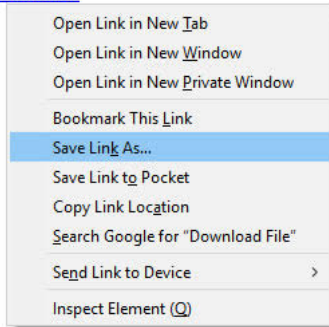
